Introduction to the Scripture Readings:

First Reading: Amos 6:1.4-7. Amos speaks against the wealthy of both Judah and Israel.

Second Reading: 1Timothy 6:11-16. As Jesus was faithful to his call in face of an hostility that led to his death, so Christians facing persecution should be faithful to God's call.

Gospel: Luke 16: 19-31. We hear the story of a very rich man who ignored the plight of a beggar sitting at his gate.

Carfin Grotto Centenary and Relics of St Bernadette:

The Grotto at Carfin was opened one hundred years ago in honour of Our Lady of Lourdes. It is fitting that the relics of St Bernadette will be in Carfin from Saturday 24th September to Saturday 1st October. Lourdes has a special place in many of our hearts, as does St Bernadette, and we can visit the Grotto throughout that week. Two particular days are of special attention: Sunday, 25th September is the National Pilgrimage when the Bishops will declare Carfin as the National Marian Shrine for Scotland. On Friday, 30th September, a Pilgrimage Day has been allocated for our Diocese of Argyll and the Isles, which we will share with Motherwell. The Church opens for private prayer at 8am and closes at 10pm. However, since our parishes are at some distance perhaps those travelling may prefer to concentrate on the afternoon with Mass at 1pm followed by veneration of the relics and the Liturgy of Water at 3pm. There is also a torchlight procession at 8pm.
