Introduction to the Scripture Readings:

Isaiah 55:6-9 — Both the first reading and Gospel remind us that God's generosity exceeds our expectations. As high as the heavens are above the earth are God's ways different from ours, proclaims Isaiah.

Philippians 1:20-24, 27 — Paul tells us that Christ means everything to him.

Matthew 20:1-16 — Jesus uses a story to show that God makes individual arrangements with each of his servants.

The famous parable, about the vineyard of the Lord, tells of people engaged to work in the vineyard at different times of the day. The agreed wage: one denarius – the minimum wage of the time. Those who worked longer expected more, but the denarius is a symbol of what sustains life: God's gift, not something earned. What kind of owner would pay less than enough to live on? God gives life itself as gift, not as wage.

During the week, Fr. Roddy will be going to Melbourne, Australia for three weeks to visit **Sister Diane**, who will be eighty on 5th October.
