Introduction to the Scripture Readings:

Genesis 2:18-24 — Includes the second creation story given in the Bible: we are taught here that man and woman are meant to be together.

Hebrews 2:9-11 — On most Sundays between now and the feast of Christ the King, the second reading will be from the Letter to the Hebrews. This was written about AD 80, to show the people of the time that Jesus fulfilled the needs of Jews and Greeks alike.

Mark 10:2-16 — Jesus instructs his followers about family life, repeating the teaching given in Genesis and telling all to be as trustful as little children.

October is Mission Month. In two weeks time we will honour the work of missionaries on Mission Sunday(weekend of 20th October). Throughout the month, we are reminded that we are called to 'Go and invite everyone to the banquet'.
