Scripture Readings:

Malachi 3:1-4 — Malachi makes a prophecy that God will send a messenger to his Temple; Christians see this promise fulfilled in the events commemorated by this feast.

Hebrews 2:14-18 — It was because Jesus was fully human that he was able to redeem humans. *Luke 2:22-40* — The Gospel describes what happened when Jesus was presented in the Temple.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the **Presentation of the Lord**, forty days after the birth of Jesus. In the encounter between old Simeon and the young mother Mary, the Old and New Testament are united in thanksgiving for the gift of Light, which shone in the darkness. In the East, this Feast is called the Feast of the Encounter: indeed, Simeon and Anna, who find Jesus in the Temple and recognize in Him the long-awaited Messiah, represent the humanity that finds its Lord in the Church. It is a beautiful encounter with God.
