Sirach (Ecclesiasticus) 27:4-7 The words people use reveal what is in their hearts. I Corinthians 15:54-58 Paul offers a hymn of victory over death; we should never give up. Luke 6:39-45 Jesus encourages integrity, and speaks against hypocrisy.

• The Alleluia is prayed/sung for the last time before Easter.

The beautiful **season of Lent** begins this week with Ash Wednesday. The forty days of Lent remind us of two Biblical events: the forty years spent in the desert by the Israelites before deliverance to the Promised Land, and Christ's entering the desert to fast for forty days, where he was tempted by the devil. The call during Lent is to focus on three things: fasting, prayer and almsgiving (giving to others). It is a time for personal reflection, renewal and reform, a time to be 'led by the Spirit' as Jesus was. Lent prepares for Easter.....we fast before we feast, we enter the desert before we are delivered. People often ask what determines the date of Easter. The Council of Nicaea, in 325 A.D. determined that Easter should be celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon of Spring. To determine the beginning of Lent, count back six Sundays before Easter. The Wednesday before the first of these Sundays is Ash Wednesday.

The **Parish Lenten programme** this year will provide all parishioners with an opportunity to enter into the spirit of Lent, using it as an opportunity to be 'led by the Spirit' as Jesus was. On Wednesday evenings, beginning 12th March at 7pm in the hall there will be Lectio Divina (which means 'divine reading' in Latin). It is a meditative way of reading a scripture passage in which we let go of our own agendas and open ourselves to what God is trying to say to us. Lectio Divina is an ancient tradition which came from the desert monks of fourth century North Africa and was then established in European monastic communities through St Benedict. If you are not familiar with this way of prayer, and even if you are, come along and be surprised!

For parishioners who would like to do a Lenten Retreat, The Ignatian Spirituality Centre are running a Lenten Retreat again this year. Books have been ordered for those who would like to do the Retreat and they are available from Fr Roddy. There will be Stations of the Cross twice weekly in the parish as well.

Friday, 7th March 2025 is a **Day of Prayer** for all those who have experienced abuse. There will be a silent hour of Eucharistic Adoration in the parish on Friday morning at 10am. Please pray for children, young people and vulnerable adults whose lives have been scarred by the abuse they have experienced at the hands of those whom they trusted. Pray also for all are engaged in the pursuit of peace, healing and reconciliation for the abused, the needy, the weak and the vulnerable.

The annual **World Day of Prayer service** will be celebrated locally on Friday, 7th March at 2.30pm in the Cowal Kirk, St John's. The service this year was written by the Christian women of the Cook Islands and the theme is, "I made you wonderful". All welcome.
