Scripture Readings:

Joshua 5:9-12 Tells the story of the Israelites' first Passover in the Promised Land — after their years wandering in the desert. 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 Paul reminds us that we are a new creation, ambassadors for Christ. Luke 15:1-3, 11-32 The story of the Prodigal Son, the Loving Father and the disapproving older brother.

On Wednesday evening there will be Lectio Divina (which means 'divine reading' in Latin) at 7 pm in the hall. Lectio Divina is an ancient tradition which came from the desert monks of fourth century North Africa and was then established in European monastic communities through St Benedict. If you are not familiar with this way of prayer, and even if you are, come along and be surprised!

Today is **SCIAF** (**Scottish Catholic International aid Fund**) **Sunday**. The special collection will go towards the work of SCIAF. In Colombia, many people are impacted by ongoing violence and conflict. With your help, we can give shelter, food and water for those caught up in violence, provide safe havens for children affected by conflict, and help communities rebuild their lives, long into the future.
