## **Scripture Readings:**

*Isaiah 50:4-7* Describes someone under attack. Our tradition applies Isaiah's writings to the sufferings of Jesus.

Philippians 2:6-11 An ancient hymn to Christ, which tells us that Jesus achieved glory through suffering. Luke 22:14 to 23:56 Luke's account of the passion is probably the most familiar. We view the sufferings of Jesus through the eyes of Peter, and Simon of Cyrene, and the good thief.

This Week is **Holy Week**, the most important week in the calendar of the church. As well as attending the services of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil (referred to collectively as the Triduum), the Church also asks us to ensure that we are reconciled and at peace with God and neighbour for the worthy celebration of Easter.

Pilate, the mob, Herod, the leaders failed to live up to their responsibilities because they did not recognise Jesus for who he really was. The reading of the Passion and the celebration of Holy Week is an opportunity to avoid the same fate. How do I act like Pilate in my daily life? Do I join in with the mob and crucify someone today? Do I act like Herod? Am I like the religious leaders of Jesus day? May God give us the courage to be witnesses.

**Church cleaning in preparation for Easter:** There will be church cleaning in preparation for Easter on Tuesday evening (15th) at 7pm. Please come along and help if you can spare an hour. Many thanks.

**Children's Liturgy**: At a parish meeting held in January to discuss youth participation, re-starting Children's Liturgy was agreed upon and a number of people at the meeting expressed their willingness to help with the organisation of this. There will be a meeting for those who are keen to help, on Wednesday, 30<sup>th</sup> April at 7pm in the church hall. Barbara Liddell, our parish Safeguarding Co-ordinator will be at the meeting to apply for PVG (protecting vulnerable group) certificates for the volunteers. Children's Liturgy will only be successful if we have willing volunteers.....and children. Please help if you can.

Starting on **Sunday**, **4**<sup>th</sup> **May**, there will be two weekend Masses in the parish instead of three. There will be a Saturday Vigil Mass at 6.00pm and a Sunday Mass at 10.00am. Not only will this bring us in line with all the parishes in the Diocese, but it will also bring more people together under one roof. New rotas for Readers and Eucharistic Ministers will be made up.

**Combined Sunday Masses** – **4**<sup>th</sup> **May 2025 (10am):** Volunteers are required to become part of a rota system for both the **Offertory Procession** and also, separately, for the **Offertory Collections** (monies) during the forthcoming 10am Mass, which begins as from Sunday, 4<sup>th</sup> May, 2025.

If any parishioner wishes to volunteer for either of these Rotas, can they please print their name and contact telephone details on the appropriate sheet, situated in the Church Porch over the coming four weeks. If enough parishioners come forward, a rota will be produced and handed out to those kindly volunteering. Readers and Eucharistic ministers will be contacted too before a new will be produced.
