Scripture Readings: First Reading: Acts 2:1-11. Luke describes the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles, and the effect it had on them.

Second Reading: 1 Cor. 12:3-7.12-13. The Holy Spirit gives different gifts to different people, for the good of the Church, the Body of Christ.

Gospel: John 20:19-23. The Risen Jesus gives the gift of the Holy Spirit to the disciples and inaugurates the mission of the Church.

The **Solemnity of Pentecost** is celebrated this weekend. On Pentecost day, the apostles spoke a new language. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, people of different languages learned to profess one faith, to the praise and glory of God. This is the real mark of God. This is the real miracle of Pentecost, and it is a miracle which, thankfully, still happens.

Next Sunday is the **Day for Life**. There will be a short service next Sunday afternoon at 3pm in the church to celebrate the Day for Life. A collection will be taken up for the apostolate of the defence of life from conception to natural death.

There will be an **ecumenical service** of worship, prayer and fellowship for Refugee Festival Scotland on Thursday, 19th June at 7.00pm in the Church of the Immaculate Conception, 2049 Maryhill Road, Glasgow. All welcome.

Dungavel Solidarity Gathering: Sunday, 15th June at 1.00pm in Dungavel House. There will be readings and reflections to advocate for human dignity over indefinite detention. Every country in Europe sets a limit on immigration detention. Except the UK. Archbishop William Nolan, President of Justice and Peace Scotland will be the guest speaker.
