Scripture Readings:

Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12 The baptistry of the Lateran Basilica is dedicated to St John the Baptist: this reading conveys the cleansing and healing power of the waters of baptism.

1 Corinthians 3:9-11, 16-17 The Christian community is the church of God: this makes its gathering place sacred.

John 2:13-22 The most important temple for us is the body of the Lord, who was raised to life as our glory and our hope.

Dedication of the Lateran Basilica: Following the Emperor Constantine granting freedom of worship to the Catholic Church in 313, the church was built beside the Laterani family and consecrated in 324. This church is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome. The basilica bears the inscription: "Omnium Urbis er Orbis terrarium Mater et Caput"..... Of All the Churches in the City and in the World, The Mother and Head. This feast was extended worldwide to the whole Church in 1565.

Our **Diocesan Jubilee Cross** arrived in the parish during the week. The Cross was made by a carpenter from Eriskay who lives in Oban, John Neil MacInnes. Why is the cross touring the parishes? The Cross is central to the Jubilee of Hope because it is the ultimate symbol of Christian hope, representing Christ's victory over death and a hope that does not disappoint. In the logo for the Jubilee Year of Hope, the cross is depicted as an anchor, representing a hope that keeps people stable through the trials and the difficulties of life.

November is the month of the **Holy Souls** when we pray especially for our Faithful Departed. In praying for the dead we highlight our faith in the power of God and we hold up the life of the person who has died so as to let God take care of things. There is still a vital flow of life between them and us. Love is stronger than the grave. November lists are available from the Church for parishioners to note down the names of loved ones who have died. These will be placed in the Holy Souls box on the altar and Masses during the month of November will be offered for our deceased brothers and sisters.

If any parishioner would like **Mass celebrated in their home**, please see Fr. Roddy. A house Mass is an ideal setting for a small group of people to come together to celebrate the Eucharist and to enjoy a time of sharing afterwards. It would be up to the person hosting the Mass to invite a small number of family/relations/neighbours/friends and to have a simple tea/coffee/biscuit afterwards if they so wish.

The parish social evening held on Friday evening with guest singer Paula MacAskill, was a great success and there was a wonderful turnout. This was the fourth time that Paula has entertained in the parish. It was so good to see people singing, dancing and reaching out to one another in love and friendship. Thank you to the Fundraising Committee who worked very hard behind the scenes to provide the snacks and to set up and clear away. £874.80 was raised for parish funds.

Reflection:
