Scripture Readings:

Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9 — God is described in terms of tenderness and compassion, kindness and faithfulness.

2 Corinthians 13:11-13 — A plea by Paul for unity in the Church, in the grace of Jesus, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit.

John 3:16-18 — Jesus came to show God's love for the world: no one who believes will be condemned.

We all warmly welcome **Magnifica Humanitas** (Magnificent Humanity), the first encyclical of Pope Leo XIV, as a timely and insightful contribution to one of the defining questions of our age. (The word encyclical comes from the Latin *encyclicus* meaning "circular" or "general". It literally refers to a "circular letter" meant to be passed around and shared with everyone)

As artificial intelligence rapidly reshapes human life, this important document calls us to place the dignity of the human person at the heart of every technological advance.

We encourage parishioners, and those outside the parish and church to read, study and pray with this landmark text.

The Office of Communications and Evangelisation will soon publish a parish study guide and other resources for small groups and parish use, helping communities to reflect more deeply on the opportunities and challenges of new technologies and their impact on human life.
